In a continued effort to best meet the transportation needs of residents, visitors, and businesses in our city, Porterville Transit has embarked upon a review of the city's public transit services. The City has retained the consulting firm of *IBI Group* to undertake this review. The review will ultimately determine how public transit may better meet the short-term and longer-term needs of the community including opportunities for service enhancements.

IBI Group has been tasked to do the following on behalf of Porterville Transit:

- A review of transit service needs and requirements and the development of service improvement options to best meet the mobility needs of residents and visitors;
- A review of current transit policies and procedures; and
- The development of an action plan to guide the implementation of transit service improvements over the next 5+ year period.

An important element in this review is public consultation. ***Your input is important to the success of future transit service delivery.*** We are seeking your input/dialogue on proposed route restructuring.

This meeting will include presentation of the results of the analysis of transit services and proposed service scenarios/route restructuring for our fixed route transit system. This is your opportunity to provide feedback on the proposed service changes.
